4.0 LIMITATIONS ON THE PLAYER CALLED UP

This section is based on LSL League Rule C7-15 PLAYER MOVEMENT (Refer to A-7 in Club Rules) or most recent League Rules and Regulations.

5.0 LIMITATIONS ON THE COACH ASKING FOR CALL UPS

In order for a coach to get a player(s) from another team the following process must be followed:

- a. Call/contact the coach of the team you need to call up from. Please check their game schedule on PTS before you call.
- b. Ask for the player by name or type of player(s) you need
- c. The coach you are contacting will sign off on the specific player or provide you a list of players to select from.

- d. Choose the players and the coach (of the team you need to call up from) will give them the info to attend your game(s) by sending an email and copying the requestor. If done by telephone please confirm verbally with the call-up player and requesting coach.

You may ask for specific players. However, the coach of the team you are asking may suggest alternatives due to many reasons such as:

- Player availability
- Player injury
- Vacations
- Game schedules

The DSC expects coaches to provide call ups as required whenever possible. We are considered a single club and must help each other out. However, if your team is playing within 24 hours of the requestor's match the request may be refused. The coach of the team that the player is rostered on has the final say in the matter. It is his/her team/player.

6.0 WHEN SHOULD YOU REQUEST CALL UPS?

F.A.Q. At 7 aside and 11 aside at what quantity of missing players should a coach request call ups? What is the playing time for 11 aside call ups versus your regular players?

7 aside: Once a coach is missing a single player he/she can ask for call ups. Playing time is not an issue at 7 aside as we recommend equal playing time for all players.

11 aside: Once you have less than 4 subs available on your bench you may ask for call ups (unless you are missing a Goal Keeper – for which you can always request a call up no matter the other subs available). Except for a Goal Keeper, a call up should not start in place of a regular team member. The only exception is if there are no regular players for a particular position (i.e. defense, midfielders or forwards). Also, if there are extra players including call ups for particular positions (defense, midfields and forwards), a call up should never get more playing time than regular team players.
